BACKGROUND

How can international youth work (IYW) activities and learning mobility be made accessible for all young people, including those with disabilities? The IJAB project VISION:INKLUSION seeks to answer that question. Representatives of the IYW community, disability community organisations, disability charities, researchers and administrators are working together to design an inclusion strategy for IYW by the end of 2017. In line with the three dimensions of the Index for Inclusion (Booth, T./ Ainscow, M., 2002, 2011), the project has three objectives:

- 1. **CREATE INCLUSIVE CULTURES:** A shared understanding of inclusion in IYW is developed and an inclusive culture is created within the IYW community.
- ESTABLISH INCLUSIVE STRUCTURES: The national expert debate is strengthened. Fresh ideas and strategies are documented and shared, allowing all actors to build and/or strengthen inclusive structures.
- 3. **DEVELOP INCLUSIVE PRACTICES:** Actors are empowered to develop inclusive practices for their international youth projects. To this end, tips and methods for the practical implementation of inclusive IYW are identified, consolidated and shared.

The United Nations' Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities calls for an inclusive education system at all levels as well as lifelong learning. International youth work (IYW) is a significant setting for non-formal and informal learning. It's self-organised and voluntary by nature, so it makes a valuable contribution towards strengthening and developing the personalities of all young people. Young people with impairments can benefit from IYW in particular measure.

OBJECTIVES OF THE SYMPOSIUM

- To enrich the development of an inclusion strategy for International Youth Work through international impulses.
- To question the current professional discourse about inclusion from an international perspective.
- To discover and discuss approaches and examples of good practice for an inclusive design and implementation of the UN Disability Rights Convention (UN CRPD) in youth work and non-formal education.
- To provide an opportunity for establishing contacts between dedicated experts and practitioners from different countries.
- To gain new impulses and ideas.

TARGET GROUP

The symposium is aimed at

- Practitioners working in youth services and youth work in Germany and abroad dealing with or having a strong interest in inclusive approaches and international exchange,
- Experts engaged in research, policy and practice related to the implementation of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with disabilities or to the inclusive design of non-formal education.
